
Corsica Linea close to charter EUROFERRY CORFU


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New ferry to be built for CalMac's Kennacraig-Islay service

A day after Scottish ferry operator Caledonian MacBrayne (CalMac) warned passengers of potential major disruption to its services this summer due to its ageing fleet, more positive news arrived from Scotland's Ministry for Transport



and Islands, Humza Yousaf, who announced that a new ferry is to be built for CalMac's Kennacraig-Islay service, to replace the 1985-built HEBRIDEAN ISLES.

Gerassimos 'Makis' Agoudimos, one of Greece's more colourful shipowners, has passed away in his late seventies in a Swiss hospital on 31 March.




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Lengthened PETER PAN floated out but not ready yet

The new ferry has been given the same name as the one it is replacing, HALUNDER JET. The ship has just (3 April) arrived in Algeciras where builders Austal will perform some additional work



before it continues its way to Hamburg, with the exact date of arrival not yet specified.

The 2018 first quarter statistics for Tallink Grupp show increases in the number of transported cargo units and passenger vehicles, while passenger numbers dropped marginally.


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Uljanik Shipyard to get lifeline from the Croatian Government

The first of two LNG-powered ferries being built by Visentini for Baleària, was launched on Thursday 29 March. The HYPATIA DE ALEJANDRIA is expected to enter service in early 2019.



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Grimaldi Group and Fincantieri sign LoI to make two Cruise-Class ro-paxes larger and greener

UPDATE:

After the signing of the LoI on 5 March, Fincantieri and the Grimaldi Group signed the contract for the lengthening and refurbishment programme of CRUISE ROMA and CRUISE BARCELONA on 30



March. Construction of the two 29m midship sections will begin in 2018 and the lengthened ships will be redelivered before the summer of 2019.

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SAPPHIRE PRINCESS sails to the UK following Singapore upgrade

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Singapore's Majestic Fast Ferry orders seven more 39m fast ferries from Indonesian yard

Majestic Fast Ferry has ordered a further
seven 39m fast ferries from Indonesian
shipyard PT Cahaya, located on the island
of Batam, to a design from Incat
Crowther.



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
