month of June, the company also broke its record, carrying 169,515 passengers, bringing Eckerö Line's market share to around 19%.



2018 second quarter statistics for Tallink Grupp – record number of passengers in the month of June

According to the figures, Tallink transported more passengers this June than it has ever done in this month previously. The total number of passengers transported on all of the company's routes in June was 989,445, a 1.4% increase over



the same month in 2017. The month also saw new passenger records on the Estonia-Finland route with 512,077 passengers, a 1.0% increase compared to the same period in 2017, and on the Estonia-Sweden route with 101,249 passengers transported, a 3.9% increase over the same period last year.
